

Winter Meeting December 7

Iris Awards and Shows, Plans for Spring on Agenda

he winter meeting will be held at Longue Vue on Tuesday, December 7 at 7 PM. The program will be on iris awards and shows, particularly for Louisiana irises. Joe Musacchia, a GNOIS Board member and apprentice American Iris Society judge, will discuss the judging rules and awards structure and of AIS and the Society for Louisiana Irises.

The only iris shows in Louisiana have been those sponsored by the Society for Louisiana Irises and held in Lafayette for around 60 years. Since SLI became a more nationally (and internationally) focused organization, the SLI annual shows have moved around the country but still occur in Lafayette about every other year. In years in which the SLI convention and show is held outside the state, the Acadiana chapter of SLI still holds a local iris show.

This year's SLI convention will be in Tucson in late April and the Acadiana show is scheduled for Saturday, April 2. In recent years, SLI conventions have been in Little Rock and Dallas.

Iris shows sanctioned by the American Iris Society must be judged by ac-

credited AIS judges and follow set judging standards and rules. AIS judges determine most show awards, although some are voted on by the membership, and most annual awards are also voted by iris judges.

The program on December 7 will focus on how all this works. It will also frame a discussion of how GNOIS might get involved in formal iris shows, an activity of interest to some members and generally very popular with the general public around the country.
